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In a longitudinal study of nearly 4,000 students, researchers found that nearly 1 in 4 students (23 percent) with "below-basic" reading skills in third grade had not graduated high school by age 19. Among "proficient" third-grade readers, only 1 in 25 (4 percent) did not graduate.

### Statistics About Struggling Readers and Reading Growth

Adults without teaching backgrounds will be most successful at supporting new readers if teachers eliminate the guesswork. Don't say, "Work on short vowel sounds." Say, "Remember, short a makes the sound /a/ like in apple. Practice reading and writing these short a words: sad, pat, map, tan."

### Teaching Reading Remotely Doesn't Need to Be One-Size-Fits-All

Each year my class has students reading all along the continuum, from developing to fluent to proficient, which means I'm sometime juggling up to six guided reading and skill groups.
